And whereas John Kinschaw one of the Commissioners named and appointed in and by the said first recited Act departed this life on or about the twenty sixth day of August one thousand eight hundred and two before any Meeting of the Commissioners appointed by the said first recited Act was held and no person having qualified as a Commissioner under the said Act and in consequence thereof and in pursuance of the power and authority given him by the said first recited Act the said William Tait on or about the ninth day of September one thousand eight hundred and two did by writing under his hand and seal appoint William Wiltlock of Brecken in the County of York Gentleman a Commissioner to act for him in the said Inclosure and in the place of the said John Kinschaw deceased. And whereas at the first Meeting of the said Commissioners duly called and holden pursuant to the said first recited Act at the Bull Inn in Henneville in the said County of Lincoln on the fourth day of December one thousand eight hundred and two the said Edward Hare William Wiltlock and Joseph Cusam attended but severally refused to qualify and act as Commissioners under the said Act. And whereas by an writing under his hand bearing date the twenty eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and two annexed to and intended to be enrolled with these presents the said Tait by virtue of the power for that purpose given him by the said first recited Act did elect and appoint Thomas Spyon of Coningsham in the County of Rutland Gentleman not being interested in the said Inclosure to act as a Commissioner under the power and authority of the said first recited Act in the stead and place of the said William Wiltlock. And whereas by writing under his hand bearing date the twenty eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and two annexed to and intended to be enrolled with these presents the said Tait by virtue of the power for that purpose given him by the said first recited Act did elect and appoint James Cook of Hawthorn in the said County of Lincoln Gentleman not being interested in the said Inclosure to act as a Commissioner under the power and authority of the said first recited Act in the stead and place of the said Edward Hare.
